one dollar per head for each dog killed and buried.
The term of service is understood to be as long as the
township Committee may think it necessary. The particular
district which he is required to examine will be given
him by the Committee. Said Ezra Beane shall furnish to
the Township Committee a list of the dogs killed the
name of the owner of the dog if possible and the
circumstances of each case. He shall exercise due
caution, dogs on the land of their owners or
accompanied by their owners or properly muzzled
are not considered as running at large. The authority
of this certificate is based on the resolution passed
by the township Committee at a regular meeting held
Feb 20th 1909.
