Section 7. That the driver of every carriage, bicycle, motorcycle, automobile, motor car or other vehicle, whether of burden or of pleasure, using any of the public roads or streets in this township, shall, in slowing up, stopping or crossing to the other side of the road or street, give a signal to vehicles behind, by raising the hand or the whip vertically.

Section 8. That drivers of carriages, bicycles, motorcycles, automobiles, motor cars or other vehicles, whether of burden or of pleasure, using any of the public streets in this township, shall upon one whistle being given by a police officer of said township come to a full stop and shall not proceed again until receiving a signal to do from such officer.

Section 9. That at the intersection of Main street with Mill street and of such other intersections as may be hereafter designated from time to time by the Township Committee, drivers of all carriages, bicycles, motorcycles, automobiles, motor cars and other vehicles, whether of burden or of pleasure, shall reduce speed at least ten feet before reaching the intersection of the said streets and shall proceed at least ten feet beyond such intersection of such streets. They shall come to a full stop at such intersections upon the order or signal of any police officer of the township and shall not proceed again until ordered or directed to do so by such officer.

Section 10. That the rider of any bicycle shall not allow the same to proceed in any street of this township, by inertia, momentum with his feet removed from the pedals. The rider of any bicycle shall not remove both hands from the handlebars while riding his or her bicycle, nor practice any trick or fancy riding, in any of the streets of this township. The rider of any bicycle shall not carry upon his or her bicycle in any of the streets of the Township of Washington, any child under the age of five years, or ride his or her bicycle on any sidewalk used by pedestrians.

Section 11. Every motor vehicle must have devices to prevent excessive noise, annoying smoke and the escape of gas and steam.
