### An Ordinance

An Ordinance to Provide for the license and regulating Hawkers, Peddlers Itinerant Vendors of Merchandise, Medicines and remedies, Circuses, Travelling and other shows, plays Exhibitions, playhouses, Music Halls or Opera Houses, Auctioneers, Common Criers and the place or places or premises in which the different kinds of business or occupation mentioned herein are to be carried on conducted, and to fix the Rate therefor and to prohibit all persons and places and all vehicles, unlicensed, from acting, using or being used in said capacities for such uses and purposes, the fees for such licenses being imposed for revenue.

Be ordained by the Township Committee of the Township of Washington in the County of Morris, a Municipal Corporation of the State of New Jersey.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to carry on the business of a hawker, peddler, itinerant vendor of merchandise, medicine and remedies, auctioneer or common crier in the Township of Washington, in the County of Morris, without having first obtained a license so to do, as herein set forth, provided that no person or persons shall be required to take out a license in order to sell any product of his farm or factory or to sell meat, milk bread or cake.

Section 2. That it shall be unlawful to hold or exhibit any circus or travelling show, play or exhibition without having obtained a license so to do, as herein provided.

Section 3. Any person or persons violating Section one hereof, shall, on conviction, be fined the sum of Twenty-five Dollars, or be imprisoned in the County jail for Twenty-five days. On conviction of violating section two hereof, such person or persons shall be fined Fifty Dollars, or be imprisoned in the County jail for Sixty days.

Section 4. The Clerk of the Said Township is hereby authorized to issue a license to the person or persons desiring to carry on or conduct the business or occupation herein mentioned, upon the payment by such person or persons applying therefor, of the following fees, imposed for the purpose of revenue.

For each hawker, peddler on foot, peddler with horse or horses and wagon, itinerant vendor of merchandise, medicines and remedies, Ten Dollars per year. For each auctioneers or common criers, Ten Dollars per year, and that no license so issued shall extend beyond the thirty-first day of December following.

For a Hall show 2<sup>50</sup> Dollars each day.

For a circus or traveling show, ~~play~~ or exhibition <sup>in tent</sup> Five Dollars for Each day.

For each playhouse, music hall or opera house, Forty Dollars per year, provided, however that the place of exhibition shall be designated in such license.

Any traveling show, play or exhibition exhibiting in any playhouse, music hall or opera house already licensed under this ordinance, shall be exempt from paying license.

Section 5 This ordinance shall take effect ~~immediately~~ Jan 1st 1917.
