Whereas, since the passing of a tax resolution for the year 1920 an emergency has arisen caused by unprecedented snow storms blocking the public roads in the Township and destroying the usefulness thereof, which said happenings could not have been anticipated, and which necessitated the expenditure of a large sum of money, to wit, the sum of Three Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$3,600.00) to keep the said roads open to traffic and in a condition of usefulness and

Whereas, this Township was and is without funds to meet the necessities and the conditions created thereby, Now therefore, Be it hereby Resolved, by the Township Committee of the Township of Hockessin, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, that an appropriation therefor be made, and that said expenditures made thereunder be funded by the issue of an Emergency Note; and

Be it further Resolved, That John O'Brien the Chairman of this Committee and Frank T. Houghright, the Clerk of this Township be and they are hereby authorized to execute said Emergency note payable December 31st 1921 to the order of the Hockessin National Bank of Hockessin, New Jersey at the Hockessin National Bank of Hockessin New Jersey for the sum of Three Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$3,600.00) in anticipation of the receipt of taxes for the fiscal year 1921, the said amount to be placed in the tax levy for that year, for the payment of Emergency expenditures.

The said Note shall be issued in anticipation of the receipt of taxes for the year 1921 and shall be sold at not less than par, and shall be payable on December 31st 1921, with interest at 6 per centum and shall be dated April 17th 1920, and bear upon the face thereof a statement of the cause or event with reference to which it was issued and the date or period thereof.
