WHEREAS, the responsibility of providing relief of various kinds insofar as it must be done out of public funds is the responsibility and function of Municipal Government, and

WHEREAS, the Township of Washington in the County of Morris in the State of New Jersey, finds itself unable to entirely meet such responsibility because of its loss of revenue through the falling off of tax payments and the failure of other sources of income and the inability of the municipality to further reduce its operating expenses.

AND WHEREAS, funds have been made available by the State Legislature to the State Financial Assistance Commission to be used by it in supplementing the relief given by such municipalities as are financially unable to adequately provide such relief.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee, L. A. Philhower, Chairman, of the Township of Washington in the County of Morris in the State of New Jersey, that application is hereby made to the State Director of the Commission for continuous month-to-month financial aid to assist in the administration of their relief program; such assistance to be a reimbursement in part of expenditures in payment of relief commitments for the months of July through December 1936. The municipality agrees that the amount of the reimbursement shall be the total amount of such relief expenditures in each month (excluding those for administration) less such amount as the
