This meeting is being held at the Washington Township Municipal Building, 43 Schooley's Mountain Road, Long Valley, New Jersey. Notices of this meeting were sent as there were requests.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u> – The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

<u>MAYOR'S UPDATE</u> – Mayor Short advised that he met with JCP&L a few times in the last month, and he also testified in front of the BPU about power outages caused by Super storm Sandy. Mayor Short noted that both entities are cooperative and receptive to feedback.

Several budget meetings are scheduled in the next several weeks. **Mayor Short** invited all residents to come and share their thoughts.

On January 31, 2013, **Mayor Short** will be attending a mayors meeting in Chester Boro to discuss shared services and OEM topics. Mayors meetings are scheduled to take place every other month going forward.

The Township Committee will be working with the MUA, DEP, EPA K-8 BOE to get generator power at Old Farmers Road School. Old Farmers is being considered as a shelter location for future emergencies.

In 2012 only one building permit and 11 CO's were issued. No new ratables are coming through. The Township is 93% residential and this impacts our budgets.

A Flu Clinic in scheduled for January 26 at the Municipal Building.

<u>PROCLAIMATION</u> Mayor Short, on behalf of the Washington Township Committee, read into the record a proclamation declaring February 2013 as Teen Dating Violence Prevention and Awareness Month.

FOOD PANTRY PRESENTATION. Rabbi Moshe Rudin, discussed the Chanukah Torch Run fundraiser which benefited the Long Valley Food Pantry. He thanked the residents of Washington Township and the business community for their generosity.

LONG VALLEY FIRST AID SQUAD PRESENTATION. Bill Kanen, Chief of Long Valley First Aid Squad, and Leanne Ajbuszyc, President of the Long Valley First Aid Squad expressed concerns about the County Communication System. The County Dispatch appears to be following procedures 50% of the time: pagers are not being activated, all the parties necessary for a call are not being reached, and incorrect information is being passed to responders. LVFAS has raised these issues with County Dispatch. Comm. Kennedy will reach out to the County Dispatch to set up a meeting to discuss issues with representatives from Police, Fire, First Aid, and IT. Comm. Tobin will also attend.

PUBLIC PORTION.

Dorothy Walter, Black River Road, spoke about a tree that fell near her home onto wires that were sparking and smoking. She called the power company and called 911. I took them 8 minutes to answer the phone. No police or fire personnel responded. The power company showed up 3 hours later.
