DISCUSSIONS

Professional Service Contracts were discussed. Interviews were conducted. The Committee would like to make sure the reporting lines are clear for the Prosecutor and Public Defender. A further discussion is planned with the three Animal Control applicants. The Committee agreed to the Township Attorney's recommendations to decrease the retainer. The Township Committee agreed to the Township Engineer's request for an approximately 1.5% increase in fees. Appointments will be made at the January 4, 2014 Reorganization Meeting.

<u>Comm. LiaBraaten</u> would like to see that the work that the Township Professional Services Personnel do for the Township is reviewed periodically, since it represents a large expense.

<u>IT Specialist Kenny</u> would like to gauge interest in tablets for the Township Committee. A tablet would be used to decrease the amount of paper that is used, and provide access to Township email and documents. He is suggesting 10" tablets in the \$300 range. <u>Mayor Short</u> would like to have a demonstration at a future meeting so the Committeemen can get a feeling for how it will work.

<u>Comm. Tobin</u> and <u>Comm. LiaBraaten</u>. discussed how some fire companies communicate using tablets and laptops, which they observed at their visit to the County 911 dispatch facility. The communication was efficient and helpful to the job that first responders do.

Sprint Tower. Mr. Kenny stated that Sprint indicated they would go live in the last part of 2014.

<u>Police Chief Bailey</u> stated that he will need a resolution so the candidate can start the academy on January 13.
