EMERGENCY RELIEF

Continuing the relief measures in co-operation with the State Relief Administration food orders were supplied to needy families and the head of the family required to work out the relief given. A total amount of \$1,751.11 was expended for food, milk, medical services, hospitalization and administration expenses. Fifty per cent of this amount was refunded by the State under a normal grant.
