CONSERVATION EASEMENTS

Conservation Easements are owned by the Township. They are a means to protect plant and animal habitats, wetlands, and steep slopes ,among other natural features.

If you have a Conservation Easement it should appear on your plot plan and in your Deed. Newer properties have conservation easement markers on the property. Conservation Easements are inspected by the town for compliance. Failure to comply can result in fines.

CLEAN WATER FOR OUR TOWN

Storm water, resulting from rain and snow, is the source of fresh water that feeds our streams, rivers, lakes and underground aquifers. As a water source, storm water must be clean and in good supply to protect our drinking water supplies.

Residents can reduce the amount of water runoff by planting groundcover, trees, gardens, vegetated borders, and watering lawns only when necessary.

Residents can help reduce the amount of pollution in runoff with buffers, avoiding the use of pesticides, and preventing objects and fluids from draining into storm water grates. Visit the Township website for more information about Clean Water.

Municipal Service Requests

A Municipal Service Request is a form-based web request for notification or service that is automatically sent to the appropriate department after it is submitted. A Service Request may include quality of life issues including loss of power, dead shade trees, the discovery of a pothole, or suspected code violations.

The Municipal Service Request is NOT a search engine for information on the site nor for emergencies that require an immediate response.

Go to the website homepage and click on the Service Request button. Fill in the request with as much detail as possible.

The Emerald Ash Borer Beetle is a nonnative insect pest that infests and kills all
species of ash trees. First discovered in
the US in 2002, these insects have been
wrecking havoc in New Jersey. Trees will
only live 3-4 years after infestation. There
are 24 million trees in NJ. If you have Ash
trees please learn more about diagnosing

All dogs & cats ,7 months or older, must be licensed per state statute.

Licenses must be renewed annually by January 31, or late fees will be assessed. Proof of rabies vaccinations is required. Rabies vaccinations must be valid through Nov. 1 of the licensing year. An annual, free rabies vaccination clinic takes place each January, contact the Health Dept. for dates & information.

The Fire Prevention Office is responsible for the enforcement of the NJ Uniform Fire Code. Every commercial building and business in the Township must be inspected annually to insure compliance. Public events must also comply with the fire code. If you are hosting/holding a large gathering, tricky tray, or other event you must notify the Fire Prevention Department.

If you are selling your home or changing tenants you must have a smoke alarm, carbon monoxide detector and fire extinguisher inspection. Please schedule as much in advance as possible. Inspection staff is part-time, and immediate appointments are not available. Inspection certificates are valid for six months, so please plan ahead.

Residents are reminded to prominently display house numbers so that emergency services can easily locate homes when needed.
